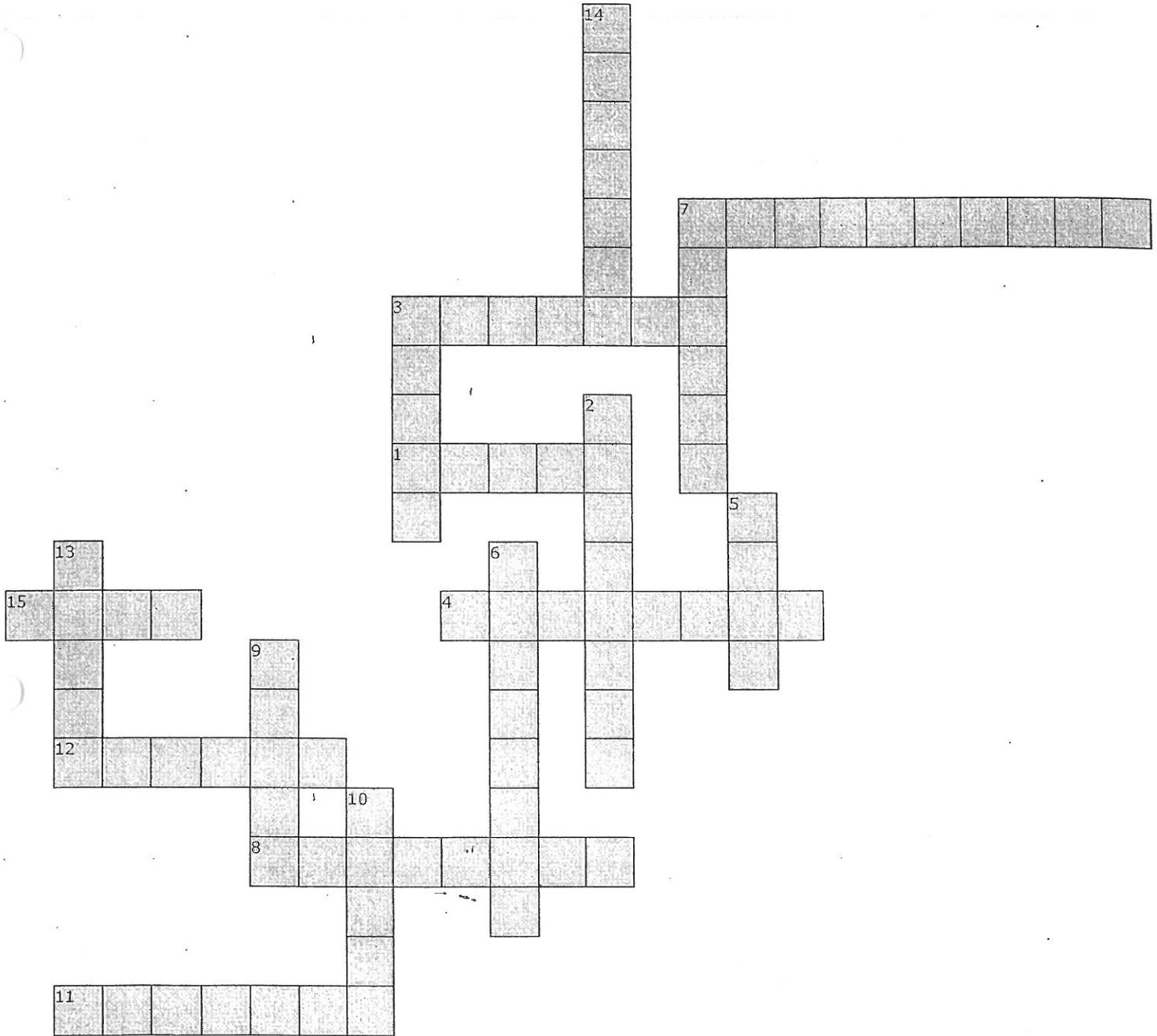


# Elements of Art and Principles of Design



## Across:

1. All elements of a picture relate to each other or look like they are part of one work of art
3. An assortment of lines, shapes, colors, textures, and forms to create interest
4. The use of lines, shapes or colors to lead the viewer from one part of the picture to another
8. The most important area of an artwork. Also called Center of Interest.  
the arrangement of objects to create a feeling of equal weight.
12. A balance composed in a circle
7. The repeated use of an element such as color, shape or line within an artwork.
15. A 3-dimensional object that is long, wide and deep

## Down:

2. A balance where objects and shapes are the same on either side of a central line
3. The lightness or darkness of tones or colors
5. The path of a moving point
6. The extreme difference in lines, colors, shapes, values or textures
7. The regular repetition of lines, color, shapes or patterns
9. A 2-dimensional or flat area defined by an outline, tone or color
10. The area within, around, between, above or below objects and shapes
13. Produced by light reflecting to our eyes
14. The surface or feel of an object :rough, scratchy
